Let us continue to work together, every week of the year (not just during PR week), to ensure our program becomes available to all.

A Vision for NA Service (from the PR Handbook):

- Every addict in the world has the chance to experience our message in his or her own language and culture and find the opportunity for a new way of life;

- Narcotics Anonymous has universal recognition and respect as a viable program of recovery





PR and H&I Serve Together

Trusted servants from the Central Ohio Area PR and H&I subcommittees put on a speaker jam (SJ) on Friday 12/13/2024 at ORW (Ohio Reformatory for Women).

Over 200 residents and 12 staff attended. Seven NA members shared their experience, strength, and hope.

ODRC leadership supports these efforts, which is helpful since each prison has their own policies and procedures.

NA volunteers are eager to participate. But, "life comes up," so get plenty of people signed up, knowing that at least a few will need to cancel.

Start three to four months in advance. Have one person coordinate volunteer applications, from filling them out with the volunteer so they are done correctly, to

submitting them to the prison, and then following up. Frequent check ins with the prison contact is essential.

Plan to start at 9:30am or 1pm to avoid chow and count. Have speakers for an hour. Then have a 15 minute break to chat, raffle off literature, pass out cookies, etc. Wrap up with speakers for another 45 minutes or so.

One member stated: "There is nothing like sharing a message of experience strength and hope to addicts who are hungry to hear it. The residents at ORW expressed so much gratitude not just for our message but for bringing our NA community to them when they can't come to us. It was a wonderful experience!"

Public Service Announcement Running in Buckeye Region

John F shares with us from the Buckeye Region, our neighbors in the northeast of Ohio.

"We in the Buckeye Region run an old PSA on TV in the middle of the night, around 2am AT (AT stands for "addict time" lol). It's a 30 second slot that airs 20 times per month.

"We notice a significant uptake on info requests through the Hopeline whenever we run it. We do this on the ABC network which covers probably 90% of the Buckeye Region.

"We pay \$10 per slot at 2am, which works out to about \$200 per month. Prime time slots during

popular shows like Good Morning America can cost up to \$600 per slot."

Our PR Handbook tells us that a PSA can be as simple as a TV announcer displaying a card with a local



phoneline number and a script that states, "If you've been affected by addiction, you can call this NA phone number." Trusted servants can explore other available broadcast resources to find creative PR opportunities in their communities.
