Guided by Fellowship input and response to the CAR survey, the 2023 World Service Conference selected this as an Issue Discussion Topic, or IDT.

Future of the WSC

From the project plan passed at WSC 2023:

The main focus of this project is to develop ideas about how a three-year cycle might work. Some of the topics that participants have raised that we anticipate will be focused on include vetting CAR motions and the CAR survey, determining what must be decided in person and what can be decided virtually, and improving communication between meetings. The ever-growing size of the WSC has been a discussion topic for years and will also need to be addressed, which will include a focus on the criteria for the seating of regions and zones.

Local Service Toolbox

The focus for the 2023–2026 cycle is virtual services, including virtual service meetings, virtual meetings and areas participating in the service system, virtual workshops and trainings, etc. The first step we are taking is to develop Virtual Service Basics.

Revising H&I Basics

Much has changed since the existing version of H&I Basics was created in 2010. This conference cycle, we are revising this piece of Board-approved service material using current H&I experience from members around the world.

Revising IP 21 Staying Clean in Isolation

Today and every day, addicts are staying clean in ordinary and extraordinary circumstances. Our Basic Text reminds us that “there is no model of the recovering addict,” and our experience has shown that we can stay clean and recover from the disease of addiction “no matter what.”

Revising H&I Basics

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## MOTIONS

#1 Approve the revised IP #21, Staying Clean in Isolation, contained in Addendum A, as Fellowship-approved recovery literature to replace the current IP #21, The Loner—Staying Clean in Isolation Maker: World Board Intent: To update this IP originally approved in 1986 with current Fellowship experience.

#2 To adopt the collaboratively created 2026–2029 NA World Services Strategic Plan contained in Addendum B. Maker: World Board Intent: To approve the results of the collaborative planning that began at WSC 2023 and continued with zonal and conference participant involvement throughout this cycle.

#3 To hold the World Convention of Narcotics Anonymous (WCNA) every 5 years, beginning in 2028. The location to be determined by the World Board based on fiscal and geographic considerations that lend themselves to, at minimum, a revenue-neutral event. (The specific changes to the WCNA Guidelines in GWSNA are shown in Addendum C.) Maker: World Board Intent: To have guidelines for the World Convention (WCNA) that reflect the changing nature of large events worldwide and support the prudent use of Fellowship resources.

#4 To direct the World Board to create a project plan for consideration at WSC 2029 to research and explore the opportunities and obstacles of providing book length pieces of literature to the incarcerated, on tablets, in addition to the IPs and audio version of the Fifth Edition Basic Text that already exist on inmate tablets. Maker: Arizona Region Co-makers: Florida, Ohio, Northern California, Southern California, Sweden, UK, Utah Intent: To give the Conference and Fellowship the ability to meaningfully discuss the opportunities and obstacles of making book length pieces of literature available to the incarcerated-on tablets.

#5 To direct the World Board, to implement artificial intelligence (AI) interpretation solutions for WSC meetings (both in-person and virtual) to replace the current human live language interpretation. Maker: South Florida Region Co-makers: Iran, UK, Nepal Intent: To eliminate language barriers, ensuring that all voices are heard globally, enhancing our communication and time efficiency during business meetings. This initiative also aims to reduce the risk of human interpretation errors and potential absences during our sessions.

### **Regional Delegate Alternate report:**

The RD/RCM meeting went well, focusing primarily on reviewing the Conference Agenda Report (CAR) workshops available through NA World Services. Members were encouraged to view the CAR videos, which provide important background and context for the motions, surveys, and discussion questions that will be considered this cycle.

A major theme of the discussion was that while the world around us continues to change, the principles of Narcotics Anonymous, our message, and our single promise remain constant. Our Traditions were emphasized as the stable spiritual foundation that allows NA to remain unified and effective regardless of external changes. Speaking of change and the ties that bind us together, at the beginning, I was asking about a projection screen which I may as well have been asking for a cassette tape. Nevertheless, Ryan was more than willing to exhibit his skills by sharing his screen through Zoom which made a big difference. I don't know truly has no place in today's world.

After the CAR videos, the group spent time reflecting on their experience as newcomers and what it feels like to come into NA feeling "terminally unique." Members shared personal experiences of feeling different, isolated, or disconnected when they first arrived. These experiences included differences related to age, race, sexual orientation, beliefs about addiction, discomfort with physical contact, skepticism about identifying as an addict, jealousy of others' apparent success, and confusion about whether their drug use "qualified." Several members shared that early meetings lacked open emotional sharing, making it harder to identify.

Members also shared what helped them eventually recognize that NA was where they belonged. Common themes included identification with other addicts, hearing honest sharing, being introduced to

members with similar beliefs or experiences, learning how others worked the Steps despite differences (including atheism or discomfort with spiritual language), finding solutions such as online meetings, and being personally welcomed through conversation, phone numbers, and follow-up.

The discussion highlighted the importance of creating a welcoming environment for newcomers without compromising NA's integrity or message. Members emphasized that newcomers often remember how they were treated more than what was said. Suggestions included avoiding telling newcomers what they should or should not say, making meetings more personal, offering schedules with contact information, and focusing on attraction rather than promotion.

The group also discussed challenges related to clarity statements, professional messaging around recovery, medication-assisted treatment (MAT), and differing recovery paths. Members stressed the importance of unity, respect, and allowing each addict the dignity of their own recovery process. Inclusion in service and reassurance that "you can keep coming" were identified as ways to help newer members take root in the fellowship.

The meeting concluded with reminders about the CAR workshop resources, the Group Conscience Collection Sheet, and the importance of submitting group input by April 2026.

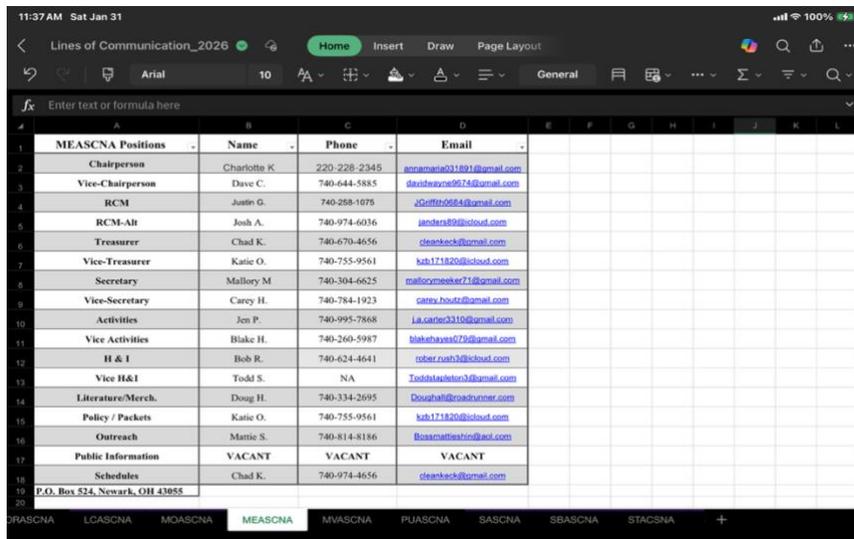

Hello family, my name is Tom, and I am an addict. Currently the RCM for the BLASCNA area.

The BLASCNA area is doing well and surviving on group 7th Tradition donations. We currently have 27 meetings in Lucas County and 2 in Fulton County. Two meetings continue as hybrid, live and on Zoom. No new meetings have started in the last three months. We've recently had 11 to 13 groups represented at our monthly ASC meeting held at 565 Palmwood, the first Saturday of each month. We purchase monthly about \$600 to \$1500 worth of literature from either the Michigan Regional Service Office or NAWS. We are currently under our prudent reserve, even though I was able to get a quarterly regional donation from the treasurer for \$300.00. ### **OCNA Advisory Committee Report**

Dear Trusted Servants,

The OCNA Advisory Committee met via Zoom on January 3, 2026, with three advisory members present: Barry B., Adam D., and Ryan A. The purpose of this meeting was to reestablish communication, review available information regarding OCNA 42, clarify current reporting status, and identify next steps in accordance with the Advisory Committee's responsibilities under the OCNA guidelines.

The most recent communication with OCNA 42 prior to this meeting involved a request for speaker contact information. Since the time of this meeting, Adam D. has had brief communication with Chris G. and received additional information that is being incorporated into the Advisory Committee's ongoing review.

It was noted that some Advisory Committee members had not yet been added to the OCNA 42 email distribution list for minutes, reports, and general correspondence. We understand this is in the process of being addressed.

The OCNA 42 website was reviewed and currently contains limited information. Based on the Chair's report, the website and registration system are expected to be updated and fully operational by the end of the month.

The Advisory Committee reviewed key highlights from the OCNA 42 Chairperson's report and appreciates the organization and progress demonstrated by the committee and its subcommittees. To avoid repetition of the full Chair's report, the following items are noted as significant.

#### Subcommittee Progress (Highlights)

- Hotels & Hospitality: Ongoing work related to space planning, buffet pricing, and hospitality room coordination. Banquet pricing has been set at \$48 per person. Recruitment of homegroups for hospitality room coverage is scheduled to begin this month.
  - Hotel: The Double Tree \$139 a night May 22-24 Holiday Express overflow  
3180 West Market St Room block: May 21-25 Book by: May 21st  
Fairlawn, Oh 44333
- Merchandising: Pre-OCNA shirt designs are in development, with plans for an initial order and a proposed budget.

- Registration: Registration materials are being distributed across multiple areas, with pre-registration being set at \$25 through December 31, 2025.
- Special Needs: Coordination for ASL interpreters is underway, along with planning for accessibility support. A budget has been approved for literature and calming supplies.
- Fundraising & Entertainment: Multiple fundraising events have been scheduled, with additional outreach planned.

### Financial Overview (Summary)

Based on the financial information provided in the Chairperson’s report, OCNA 42 currently appears to be in a stable position. Income, expenses, and available balances are tracking in a manner consistent with prior conferences and within expected ranges for this stage of planning.

- Current Balance: \$9,120.21
- Facility Deposit: \$1,425.00

Without access to the contract(s), we are unable to review projected costs, room rates, attrition clauses, banquet obligations, or other contractual financial responsibilities. Until then, our financial assessment remains preliminary and based solely on the Chairperson’s report and available financial summaries.

The Advisory Committee also reviewed recent OCNA guideline updates, including:

- The requirement that the OCNA Advisory Committee review hotel contract(s) prior to signing
- Changes to the seed money structure

It was noted that seed money from OCNA 41 was passed directly to OCNA 42 in accordance with the updated guidelines.

The Advisory Committee discussed ongoing communication and support between itself and the OCNA 42 Committee. Barry B. shared that, due to being within the same region, he has had more direct contact and interaction with the OCNA 42 committee and was able to provide helpful insight and updates during our meeting. His input assisted in clarifying several areas and contributed greatly to our overall understanding of the committee’s progress.

We also recognize that the Buckeye Region OCNA 42 Committee members bring a high level of experience and familiarity with hosting the Ohio Convention. Their ability to execute this event successfully is evident and reflects a “wash, rinse, repeat” process built on years of experience. Because of this, we understand why the Advisory Committee may not have been needed as heavily in the early stages. However, we want to clearly express that the OCNA Advisory Committee is available and willing to support in any way that is helpful, and we welcome opportunities to be of service as the planning process continues.

The Advisory Committee would also like to encourage all Areas to continue hosting OCNA fundraising events. While this has traditionally been an unspoken expectation, we feel it is important to state it clearly and encourage Areas to begin planning fundraising efforts earlier rather than later for future OCNA conventions. Early fundraising supports financial stability, shared responsibility, and long-term success of the conference.
