I also want to acknowledge and thank Betsy M. for stepping into the Vice Secretary position. Having worked this role for some time now, I can say with confidence that it functions best when two people share the responsibility. Betsy and I both take this work seriously, and we appreciate the confidence the Region has shown in us.

As you look through the minutes, you'll notice that the format has been updated. This change wasn't made lightly. Over the past year, I've struggled with the previous layout on Apple devices, and since both Betsy and I

use Apple products, it became clear that adjusting the structure would help us get the minutes out more efficiently. The new format is designed to be cleaner, easier to navigate, and more compatible across devices, especially for those who rely on mobile access.

Regional Delegate report

Greetings NA family,

First and foremost I would like to thank the Ohio Region for the opportunity to be of service to this body. I would like to apologize ahead of time because this is going to be a lengthy report and may seem somewhat mundane and boring but the information that I have to bring back is very important to our fellowship for its growth and its future. So I guess the easiest way to start this would be to possibly take this on a day by day basis of going through what the World Conference was all about and also the results that we have on all of the motions that were presented in the CAR & CAT. I do have copies of a glossary. That will show what some of these acronyms mean in the Fellowship. There were several workshops throughout the conference and also a lot of motions to go through. We had a proposed order of business for the WSC 2026. So with that being said some of them will not be followed in order from numbers 1 through 22. This was done in order to make business move more smoothly and also things that had over 80% consensus support would be without any discussion. We began the session with over 130 delegates. The highest number that I had recorded was a 144 delegates throughout the conference. With that being said motion #22 Approve 2025 Interim WSC Minutes was carried 95.3% Motion #19 remove roll call from GWSNA which is the Guide to World Service was carried 82.95% with no discussion Motion #20 add reconsideration process to GWSNA was carried with 86.15% consensus support motion # 1 Approve Revised IP #21 was carried 99.24% with no discussion motion to adopt 2026 to 2029 strategic plan was carried at 93.85% with no discussion Motion #3 was with 76.52% the four amendments all lacked strong support or motion # 4 research book length literature for inmate tablets Strong support and was carried I'm sorry I believe I missed the percentage on that one Motion number 5 to implement AI artificial intelligence interpretation for WSC failed 18.32% consensus not in support the amend one and 24 motion number 5 also lacked strong support. Motions numbers 8,9,10, 11, 6,7,13,14,and 15, all with consensus support between 85 to 93%. Motion #12 Safety and Belonging gender neutral language did reach consensus support 115 yes 24 against 3 abstain and 4 present not voting. Motions #16,,21 and 17 all carried with consensus support between 86 and 94%. Motion #18 did reach consensus support 127 yes 14 no 2 abstentions three present not voting with 88.81%. If you do not remember what all of these motions were for I do have copy of the proposed order of business for WSC 2026 included in the report.

There were new regions seated for 2026 Nordeste Brazil Rio Grande de Sol Brazil and also Thailand. One of the first couple of workshops was on diversity and welcoming and also for the newcomer some ways of conquering diversity in welcoming the newcomer is to have greeters welcome packets a free book various options changing the format for the newcomer a phone list and also get the newcomers phone number and call them don't wait on them to call you eating after the meeting with no strings attached because sometimes newcomers don't have a lot going on in the finance department adjusting the time for recovery houses so they could possibly make the meetings get them involved regardless of clean time work with them Personal responsibility to share have like a job fair but make it a recovery fair about service these are some things that we discussed that would possibly make it more welcoming to the newcomers Get them involved because as a result of our world today Narcotics Anonymous as a whole has had a total meeting growth up 6% on a global

scale however in the United States the average growth is minus 1% and we are the only place that has a minus percentage of meeting counts going down Western Europe Iran the mid Middle East Africa Canada Brazil and so on Russia all have growth except for the USA which has which is minus 1% I will also include in my report a chart on that as well. With that being said our very own region the Ohio region in 2016 had 545 weekly meetings and now in 2026 it has approximately 445 weekly meetings. It was spoken of that some of the reason while our meeting attendance has gone down is that we have online meetings which sometimes aren't registered with an area and also we just don't have people coming back after what happened in 2020 Also some of this can be attributed to recovery houses recovery centers rehab centers detox doing their own recovery meetings The sad part of that is is that some people believe that this is truly a recovery meeting especially if they misuse the name and say it's a Narcotics Anonymous meaning just because they use Narcotics Anonymous literature at the recovery home or house and the other reason why why attendance has gone down is because some of our older members just are not coming back We need to reach out to these older members and let them know that we need them and remind them that when they came there were people here that had time also and we need to see them at our meetings. There is also a great deal of potential for meetings on the Continent of Africa there's a tremendous amount of growth that is going to take place there because Narcotics Anonymous is not very well widespread especially given the fact that they have over 54 countries on that continent alone

There was a great Narcotics Anonymous history presentation by Chris and Boyd which went through the entire history of How Narcotics Anonymous got started how it almost failed but on and became the fellowship that it is today. There is some good information on the history of Narcotics Anonymous that you could access yourself at Na.org searching under history. We also have the results of the 2026 CAR survey responses From 53 delegates whether it be regions and zones 9188 individual members responses in 15 languages I will also try to put a copy of that in my report as well This was the one where you had to choose up to two on new recovery literature, revision to recovery literature, new service material, revised service material and issue discussion topics.

As far as our finances go I was given \$2300 prior to going to the World Conference as you all know the world was going to pay for Marvin's room And per diem however However when I checked out of the hotel they told me that it was paid by the world also A few days prior to me leaving for California I received a check in the mail from World Services for \$700 for per and travel expenses like taxis or Ubers So with that being said the hotel cost and my per diem cost did not cost our region anything so my total expenses were \$37.83 for \$464.78 for the plane flight which makes my total expenses \$502.61 cents therefore I will be giving a check writing a check to our Treasurer for one thought returning 1797.39. Also, I did not even factor in the gasoline for the two hour drive to and from the airport in Cleveland because it was cheaper to fly from Cleveland than from Detroit or Columbus. Keeping all of this in mind I truly believe especially given the information about world services and some of their expenses, that in the Spirit of being fully self supporting I will be making a motion that in addition to our donation to the world that we also donate the \$1797.39 to the world in addition to our regular donation to make us fully self supporting and also to help offset some of the cost to world services. I guess it was all worth it because I was given the privilege and the honor to be the closing speaker of the world conference of 2026.

Currently the RCM for the BLASCNA area. I am here today with our RCM Alternate, Charles F.

The BLASCNA area is doing well and surviving on group 7th Tradition donations. We currently have 28 meetings in Lucas County and 2 in Fulton County. Two meetings continue as hybrid, live, and on Zoom. No new meetings have been added to our meeting directory in the last three months. We've recently had 10 groups represented at our monthly ASC meeting held at 565 Palmwood, the first Saturday of each month. We purchase monthly about \$600 to \$1500 worth of literature from either the Michigan Regional Service Office or NAWs. Our area meeting is happening today, so I could not bring a donation this quarter. I have requested the area treasurer to mail our 7th Tradition donation to the region in the report I am presenting in my absence at the ASC meeting today. Currently, the ASC bank balance as of June 1st is \$ 4,569.50. Our ASC balance decreased due to TACNA 27 seed monies. TACNA 27 has begun holding fundraisers, so watch the regional website for event postings. There was a speaker jam earlier this month and another event coming soon.

Currently, our area still needs a vice-chair, a vice-treasurer, a PR chair, and an Outreach chair. H&I hosts meetings in 3 facilities weekly, with a total of 7 H&I meetings weekly. H&I had a successful Learning Day in June with 50 members attending. Phone lines continue to get 3 to 5 calls each week, along with a dozen spam calls.

The Treasurer reported on the Fifth Third Business Checking account for the period from April 1, 2026, through April 30, 2026. The beginning balance was \$5,821.55. During the period, four checks totaling \$1,296.37 and three withdrawals or debits totaling \$247.38 were recorded. One deposit of \$2,313.77 was received, resulting in an ending balance of \$6,591.57.

Recurring expenses included Zoom, Hamilton TAS, and U-Haul storage.

STACSNA

Greetings, groovy people!

STACSNA is the Stark, Tuscarawas & Carroll County area. We have meetings in 5 counties, including those already mentioned, as well as Wayne and Summit Counties.

We have good news and bad news to report this cycle. The bad news is that we continue to bleed meetings. In a single week in June, we had 3 meetings close – two of them were some of the longest standing meetings in the area. One had been in existence for 32 years. We now have 14 groups with 15 weekly meetings, including one virtual meeting.

Part of our good news is that we had a meeting join us from the Wooster, Ohio community. The Saturday Morning Serenity group had not been affiliated with any Area for several years and decided to join us.

Our ASC meets on the 2nd Sunday of the month at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in downtown Canton, using a hybrid format. Most of our groups attend during most months.

We have 4 H&I presentations – one at a men's correctional facility, two at men's treatment facilities, and one at a co-ed treatment facility. One of the contributors to our Area losing meetings is that treatment centers in Stark County stopped bringing their clients to NA a few years ago.

As we listen to GSR reports at Area Service, several groups report an average attendance of less than 5 people with maybe only 1 or 2 newcomers during the past month. Some of the treatment centers have told us in the past that they stopped bringing people due to the predators in our rooms. Our H&I Chair is reaching out to them to see what, if anything, we can do to heal our relationships.

The meetings in Tuscarawas and Wayne Counties are not having these issues. Their meetings are full. However, their challenge is that they have more newcomers than established members. So, we are working hard to help the newer folks learn the language and Traditions of NA.

Last month, our Area Chairperson admitted to a relapse, so our current Area-level vacancies include: Chair, Vice Chair, RCM-Alt, Vice Treasurer, PR Chair, and Activities Chair.

Although we currently do not have a PR Chair, we have an extremely busy PR calendar – staffing events on an ad hoc basis. In the past 3 months, we attended two “We Believe in Canton” events hosted by the Canton Police Department and wellness fair at a local spiritual center. We also continued our public bulletin board blitz. In addition to the business cards we had made, we also made 6x8 and 8x10 cardstock signs and have been distributing them on bulletin boards and to every social service agency we can think of. The 6x8s have been wildly popular, and our printer gave us a great idea. In addition to asking people to hang them with thumb tacks, we also purchased some adhesive easels off of Amazon that can be stuck to the backs of the signs, so they stand up! We have passed out over 200 of these in the past couple of months.

We also found another great use for the PR business cards. One of the local churches that does a monthly grocery give-away includes packets of information from various community resources in the grocery bags. In June, they included our business cards with a few hundred bags of distributed food.

Our PR committee is scheduled to participate in 6 more Overdose Awareness, Addiction Awareness, and health & safety events between now and mid-September.

There will be 2 events in our area next month – both on the same day. On August 22, the Saturday Serenity group in Wooster will celebrate its 25 year anniversary. Also on that date, we will be hosting the OCNA fundraiser poker run. There are flyers at Region for the poker run. We welcome all vehicles, so load a bunch of your sponsees into your VW Microbus and come join us!

STACSNA did vote to make a \$100 donation to ORSCNA this cycle.

I have been involved with the Arizona Regional Web Team, as they call it here, and it's likely that I will be taking on the Web Team Chair position in the next 6 months or so. I have been doing some training with the current Chair who is also named Marc R. I have told him that I can't take over until I complete the ORSCNA phonline system project. So, my focus now turns to getting our phonline system in place so we can eliminate the Town Hall system and save around \$3500/year. Here are some of the things that were completed over the last quarter by either Missy or me:

1. Missy and I have had our last Zoom meeting to do training, and I have covered all the things that were on my list to go over with her. Things are coming along pretty well. She has been doing all the event flyers for the last few months as well as several other tasks that she felt comfortable taking over. I will still be available if needed of course.
2. I created a comprehensive document of instructions for Missy and future Webmasters and sent that to her a few weeks ago. Convention Information

The OCNA 43 Executive Body convened on May 31 and June 21, 2026, to assess committee progress, address operational concerns, and advance preparations for the upcoming convention. At the May meeting, members reviewed both ongoing and new matters and officially approved GroupMe as the designated communication platform. In June, a poll was conducted to select the convention theme, ultimately choosing "In Loving Service."

During the May session, the treasurer recommended obtaining an EIN and confirmed that a bank account had been opened at Fifth Third Bank. The treasurer later reported electronically that the convention balance was \$1,782.00, stemming from preregistration sales during OCNA.

Hotels and Hospitality continued efforts to secure a convention venue, conducting walkthroughs and evaluations at several hotels. The Hilton Netherland Plaza was inspected, but other locations proved challenging due to unavailability, rejected proposals, restricted services, or lack of response.

The Fundraising and Entertainment Committee held its inaugural meeting on June 10 and began planning activities for July, August, and September. A fundraiser scheduled for August 1 in Chillicothe, titled "the Buckeye Bush," was confirmed, while additional opportunities in Dayton are being considered. The committee also agreed to host a virtual Speaker Jam on July 26 named "Soldiers of Recovery."

We are requesting that the \$5,000 budget from OCNA 42 be transferred to OCNA 43. We encourage all regional areas to participate by organizing an OCNA fundraiser locally. Please contact Chris D. or Monica G. if you would like to coordinate a fundraiser for the OCNA regional convention. If any supplies remain from OCNA 42, we ask that these be donated. All materials will be used and passed along to future committees.
